Volunteers are groups dedicated to the peace committee's social work such as visit the sick and the vulnerable, the hunger, at home and hospital. Food and relief supplies are provided as needed

Garbage collected, then the area was poured with lime and sprayed with vinegar for disinfection



Waste Management at Mae La Camp

At Mae La, Zone B, COERR staff arranged a training on waste management, awareness raising video show, guiding in solid waste separating and recycling. Eventually, cleaning supplies were distributed to training participants numbering 257, including 73 male and 184 female

Waste Management in Host Communities

200 volunteers are rotating work in Waste management, collection, separation of solid wastes along the farms and waterways in Mae Ok Hoo village on July 8 and 13th



20 pieces of 200litre- trash bins and cleaning supplies such as sweeps, sacks and hand gloves were supplied to 5 host-communities for their garbage collection on July 29th.
